This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows any person to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

CONDITIONS OF USE

Product to be used:

PENNZOZEB 750 DF FUNGICIDE
PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 750 g/kg MANCOZEB as their only active constituent.

FARMOZ MANCOZEB 800 AGRICULTURAL FUNGICIDE
PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 800 g/kg MANCOZEB as their only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Crop	Diseases	Rate
Pistachio	Anthracnose (<i>Colletotrichum</i> spp.) & Panicle and shoot blight (<i>Botryosphaeria</i> spp.)	150 – 200 g / 100L

Critical Use Comments:

- Apply as a protectant spray by airblast sprayer, knapsack or equivalent.
- Apply in adequate spray volume to ensure thorough coverage of all plant surfaces.
- Make first application during early bloom. Repeat application as necessary.
- DO NOT apply more than 6 applications per crop with a minimum re-treatment interval of 14 days between consecutive applications.
- Mancozeb should be applied as a protectant spray
- Use disease prediction models such as the Leaf Wetness Model developed in California to determine favourable disease conditions.

Withholding Period:

DO NOT harvest for 14 days after final application.

Jurisdiction:

ACT, NSW, QLD, SA, TAS, WA & NT only.

(Note: Victoria is not included in this permit because their 'control-of-use' legislation means that a permit is not required to legalise this off-label use in VIC).

Additional Conditions:

This Permit provides for the use of a product in a manner other than specified on the approved label of the product. Unless otherwise stated in this permit, the use of the product must be in accordance with instructions on its label.

Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit.

Export of produce:

To allow treated produce to be supplied or otherwise made available for human consumption Temporary Maximum Residue Limits (TMRL) have been established for Mancozeb covering the commodity Pistachio nuts at 3mg/kg. The MRL applies only to produce marketed and consumed in Australia. If treated produce is to be exported, due account should therefore be taken of the residue definition and residue limits/import tolerances of importing countries and that any residues must not exceed those requirements of the importing country.
